### English

Our new book The Gardener by Sarah Stewart follows a young girl's love of gardening during the Great Depression. Children will research flowers, learn their Latin names and discover fun facts. The text type is an informal letter. We'll explore the layout for letter writing, using alliteration, metaphors, adjectives, and idioms while considering the child's emotions and practicing past tense. If you have a passion for horticulture, let us know-you might even give a talk?

#### Maths

Year 3: We will be using the correct vocabulary for fractions looking at the numerator and the denominator, orderina fractions, comparina fractions and working out equivalent fractions. To make it more practical, we will draw the fractions to see how many parts make a whole and seeing which fraction is smaller / bigger.

Year 4: We are learning the same as above, as well as looking at improper and mixed fractions, adding and subtracting fractions, equivalent and simple fractions. We will also be looking at how to convert between mixed and improper fractions.

#### Learning Means the World - Our Wider Curriculum

Window on the World - Settlements and Trade We will by looking at how ways in which people live sometimes have consequences for the environment. By exploring places with different climate zones, we will compare and describe how climate affects living things.

The children will investigate how different ways in which people live around the world and how sometimes have consequences for the environment and the lives of others from local to global scales.
